The Vision of the College is to scaffold students into becoming professionally responsible teachers, dedicated to the holistic development of their pupils through selfless service to the community.


Our **Mission** is to chisel our students into:

















COLLEGE REPORT

M.Ed. College Report (2018-2020)

Semester I

Student Reflections:

Being new to the programme, students struggled to find adequate notes to support the classroom learning. We realized we had to spend a lot of time in the library reading the books identified in reading lists under each course in the curriculum.

Semester II

May 2019

Commenced in the month of May with an orientation from the concerned lecturers of courses included in the semester. College closed for summer vacation in the month of May.

June 2019

College reopened in June. The semester was similar to Semester 1 with the exception of the assessment. Students were exposed to diverse methods of examination e.g. open book system, multiple choice questions, etc

July 2019

Students celebrated St. Ann's feast with a lot of "shor sharaba" along with senior M.Ed. students and B.Ed. students.

This semester saw an increase in co-curricular activities in the form of drama, art, music, yoga, and meditation. In solidarity with the government directives, the College celebrated International Yoga day in which we participated with great enthusiasm.

August 2019

On Independence Day, we participated in the flag hosting ceremony and took part in the march-past to salute the great nation whose constitution enshrines democracy, freedom, fraternity and secularism.

As part of the instructional design course, we visited our respective B.Ed. colleges to teach two papers – thus completing the practical aspects of this course.

INTRODUCTION


LIBRARY ORIENTATION

CONCLUSION

With the cooperation of the students and the faculty members, during the Induction programme we were able to record the feedbacks of the students in Expert talks, school Visit. This programme equipped students to boost their educational pursuits, work-culture, school exposure, social experiences, and various institutional activities. Students are made aware about multidisciplinary areas to transcend from subjective knowledge to the application of subject in real life situations.

Report on Student Induction Programme – M.Ed.

Student induction programme was conducted for the batch 2019-2021 of M.Ed. students from 21st of October 2019 to 26th of October 2019 as proposed by the University Grant commission. Students Induction covered a number of different aspects (SAGE) with a focus on:

- **Socializing**: meeting other new students, senior students, students union, lectures by Eminent people;
- **Associating**: visits to college, visits to Branch/ Programme of study important places in campus.
- Governing: rules and regulations, student support
- **Experiencing:** Subject lectures, study skills, small-group activities, physical activity, creative and performing arts, literary activities, universal human values, etc.
- Prayer Service and Institution orientation by Prof Dr Sr Marry Kutty began with a prayer song and
 invoking the presence of God with a scripture reading followed by an orientation to the vision and mission
 of the college. A documentary on the history of college familiarizing students with the mile stones achieved
 by the college was presented. The feedback from students showed 100% good.
- Department orientation: An orientation to the objective of the course and future prospects were given. A generalized view of the functioning of the department and different aspects of curriculum for holistic development was made known to the students. The faculty members were introduced. The feedback from students showed 88% good and 12% satisfactory.
- Mentor-mentee groups self introduction by the students mentioning their aspirations and objective of joining the course. The students also expressed how they match their expectations with expectations of their family. The feedback from students showed 100% good.
- An orientation to the course structure included semester wise core papers and electives that can be selected.
 As it is a thesis based course emphasis was laid on preparing students for active research apart from teacher educators.
- Mentoring with Universal Human values session included an anecdotal approach to human values and their
 implications for teacher education. The emphasis was on need to prepare humanistic teachers with strong
 personalities. The feedback from students showed 100% good.
- Creative Arts and Culture: Students presented artifacts created by them such as embroidery work, making
 things from waste such as news paper, old magazines etc. They were encouraged to speak about the rich
 heritage of India and how to preserve it. The feedback from students showed 82% good and 38 %
 satisfactory.
- Gratitude towards people: A brief orientation of the idea of gratitude was followed by a brainstorming session with a focus on being thankful, paying obeisance, respect and wellbeing of others. Ways of expressing gratitude were discussed by the students. The topic of. Students were asked to note down

help and assistance that they have received from people whom they are associated with and also the way they have reverted back in showing their gratitude. The objective was to make a differentiation between material and non material aspects of gratitude. They were asked to note down the different ways in which one can show gratitude thereby stressing on verbal and non verbal gestures. The feedback from students showed 100% good.

- Lecture by Alumni: Alumni Ms Sirisha shared her experiences related to the course who cleared all apprehensions regarding the programme and research work specifically. The students were more open and raised varied questions. The feedback from students showed 88% good and 12 % satisfactory.
- Library Orientation: Orientation to all the different sections of the library followed by the online journals was explained. The library rules were, made known to the batch of students. 75% responded good, 12% responded satisfactory and 12% responded as need improvement.
- Human needs: The session on human needs was based on Sigmund Freud theory of psychodynamics of id, ego and super ego. The feedback from students showed 88% good and 12 % satisfactory.
- Lectures by eminent educationist by Prof T. Mrunalini, Dean Osmania University to inspire the students into the profession. She emphasized on the need for accountable and competent teachers. The feedback from students showed 100% good.
- Orientation to practical activities/Internship: Orientation to the different internship programmes were given
 by the faculty. The phases at B.Ed College, special schools were made explicit. The importance of the
 practical aspects such as communication skills in English and community engagement programmes were
 emphasized. As it is a thesis based course the practum is focused on developing research skills. The
 feedback from students showed 100% good.
- Peer pressure: the emphasis was on healthy competitive spirit among the students. The need to draw a line between the basic needs and luxury was highlighted. The need to strengthen once own personality and minimize the external negative influence was stressed. The feedback from students showed 75% good and 25 % satisfactory.
- Orientation to Elective was done by Dr Sarah Thomas. The nomenclatures of generic and open electives
 were explained. Generic electives add to the generic proficiency and open electives that are more discipline
 centered were introduced to the students. The feedback from students showed 100% good.
- Orientation to SWAYAM with a focus on the type of courses and the process of registration was explained
 on Swayam platform. The importance of few of the courses that can be parallel taken up was introduced
 in Research methodology, Educational Psychology, Environmental Studies, art &craft and Technology.
 The feedback from students showed 100% good.
- SWOT Analysis: The students were oriented to SWOT analysis of individuals where the strength is internal positive personal traits that have to be identified and focused upon. Identifying positive personal traits,

relevant skills, competencies and work experience, solid education, strong network, commitment, enthusiasm and passion. Work on the weaknesses such as negative personal characteristics and poor work habits, work experiences, lack of adequate education, inadequate networking, lack of career direction and weak professional or career – management skills. Identify favorable trends, specific job opening, projects, emerging demand for new skills, use of new technology and making referral to high powered contact. The feedback from students showed 100% good

- Prosperity: Introduced the concept of prosperity and the seven principles as given by Kim DH, ie think, see, measure, flow, control, and move and multiply. A group activity was designed and questions such as what is prosperity, areas of prosperity, its relationship with education were discussed. Few suggestions were to spread love, learn from life, show respect, be responsible, be decent, admit your mistakes, forgive, change, learn to create abundance, practice and reflect, and be positive were illustrated with real life experiences.
- Orientation to Evaluation/ Credit system Plagiarism: The existing evaluation process in the course was
 explained in detail. The credits allocated to different course papers were discussed. The importance of
 originality in presenting the seminars and assignments were emphasized. The feedback from students
 showed 75% good and 25 % satisfactory.
- Orientation to certificate courses and their objectives were done for professional development as a teacher educator.
- Relationships: The *relationship* between student and *teacher* plays a large *role* in the trajectory of a child's academic success and social development. Establishing a positive and healthy *relationship* with students, colleagues and management is very important. During the session, the seven relationships scenarios of day to day life was discussed which are as follows.
 - Parents-children (maataa & pitaa, putra-putri)
 - Teacher-student (guru-shishya)
 - Brother-sister (bhai-behan)
 - Friend (mitra)
 - Saathi-sahayogi (leader-assistant at work place)
 - Husband-wife (pati-patni)
 - System related (Vyavasthaagata sambandh.

The various values that these relationships can build including Trust (Vishwas), Respect(Samman), Affection (Sneha), Care (Mamta), Guidance (Vatsalya), Gratitude (Kritagyata), Reverence (Shraddha), Glory (Gaurav) and Love (Prema) were also discussed.

Responses to open questions:

- 1. Importance of yoga and other exercises for health
- 2. The benefits of feedback is that it helps me grow as a group. It makes me feel that I can rely on others and that they will help me when needed. It also helps me to improve my skills and allows me to identify where more work is needed. Also sometimes, having another person's perspective changes my view on something and allows me to develop a deeper understanding of the topic.

The Goal is Not the Point

Let's think for a moment, that our lives are like a treasure hunt.

Really...it's not much of a leap. Like any good treasure hunt, we all have a map to guide us. In life, the map is our corner of the universe. Some of the areas on the map we know quite well. These areas are the places and people and things that we're familiar with and that are part of our daily life. Other areas of the map are foreign by individuals. These yet-to-be-explored regions are home to the milestones in life that we can imagine reaching, but that have eluded us thus far. This undiscovered portion of the map is where our hopes, goals and dreams live. These goals are like little pieces of buried treasure that are hidden somewhere out on the map, somewhere that we hope to get to, soon.

One day, a particular goal grabs each individual's attention and then decide to set out on a treasure hunt.

Searching for Buried Treasure

As we begin the long hike toward our treasure and encounter a challenge or two along the way. Already the actual path is starting to look different than the buried treasure that we had been imagining. Things got worse when we finally arrive to the spot of the treasure. This whole time, we had been imagining a chest filled with gold. After uncovering the treasure, however, all we can find are a few scraps of silver and some antique relics. These items are valuable in their own right, for sure, but they were not what we were thinking about this whole time. By saying to ourselves, "This doesn't look like the treasure I was envisioning! I must be on the wrong path. I wasted all this time!" After thinking for a few moments, wondering, "Hmm... maybe I should switch goals? I bet there is bigger treasure elsewhere."

Theory Vs. Practice

We've certainly experienced situations similar to the treasure hunt described above. Perhaps that every individual have too.

I'm talking about situations where the goal we were excited to pursue—getting a degree, starting a new exercise routine, making a career change—turns out to look very different in practice than in theory. It's natural to feel a sense of disappointment or confusion or frustration when this occurs, but I think the deeper problem is rooted in how we approached the treasure hunt in the first place.

Goals as a Compass

The problem with a treasure hunt is that most people spend all of their time thinking about the treasure. The fastest way to get to a particular spot, however, is to set your compass and start walking. The idea here is to commit to our goal with the utmost conviction. Develop a clear, single-minded focus for where we are headed. Then, however, we do something strange. We release the desire to achieve a particular outcome and focus instead on the slow march forward.

Pour all of our energy into the journey, be present in the moment, and be committed to the path we are walking. Know that we are moving unwaveringly in one clear direction and that this direction is right for us, but never get wrapped up in a particular result or achieving a certain goal by a specific time.

Otherwise we can say, our goal becomes our compass, not our buried treasure. The goal is our direction, not our destination. The goal is a mission that we are on, a path that we follow. Whatever comes from that path—whatever treasure we happen to find along this journey—well, that's just fine. It is the commitment to walking the path that matters.

This reminds me of a saying by the most popular American actor...

Letting go of how it might come to pass. "As far as I can tell, [success] is just about letting the universe know what you want and working toward it, while letting go of how it might come to pass. Your job is not to figure out how it's going to happen for you, but to open the

door in your head and when the doors open in real life, just walk through it. Don't worry if you miss your cue. There will always be another door opening." –Jim Carrey

Choose your goals and then forget them. Set them on a shelf. Trust that your direction is true and pour your energy into walking the path. Good goals provide direction to your life. They allow you to commit to a journey. They are like a rudder on a boat, directing your energy and attention in specific direction as you move downstream.

We all have a map to explore. Choose a path and then walk it...


